rekrutacji studentów na wyjazdy w ramach umowy Akademii Pomorskiej z Winona State University

CEL I ZAKRES PROCEDURY

§1

Procedura określa zasady kwalifikacji oraz realizacji mobilności studentów Akademii Pomorskiej w Słupsku (AP) w ramach umowy AP z Winona State University, zwanej dalej Uczelnią Partnerską.

§2

WYMOGI FORMALNE

- 1. O stypendium zagraniczne w ramach umowy mogą ubiegać się studenci, którzy spełniają następujące warunki:
 - 1) są zarejestrowani na studiach stacjonarnych/niestacjonarnych, pierwszego lub drugiego stopnia,
 - są obywatelami Polski lub posiadają prawo stałego pobytu na terenie Polski bądź status uchodźcy,
 - 3) są studentami kierunku, który zgodnie z ustaleniami z Uczelnią Partnerską jest akceptowany w danym roku akademickim. Informacja o akceptowanych kierunkach jest podana do wiadomości studentów w każdym procesie rekrutacyjnym (plakaty, ulotki, EHMS, Biuro ds. Nauki)
 - 4) w momencie wyjazdu na stypendium nie przebywają na urlopie dziekańskim,
 - 5) w momencie wyjazdu na stypendium nie zalegają z żadnymi zobowiązaniami wobec AP.
- 2. Wyjazd stypendialny w ramach programu Umowy wynosi jeden semestr lub cały rok akademicki.





- 3. Oceny kandydatów na wyjazd dokonuje Komisja Rekrutacyjna.
- 4. W skład Komisji Rekrutacyjnej wchodzą:
 - 1) Prorektor ds. Nauki,
 - 2) Kierownik Biura ds. Nauki,
 - 3) Pracownik Biura ds. Nauki.
- 5. Rekrutacja na semestr letni trwa od 30 września, natomiast rekrutacja na semestr zimowy trwa do 30 czerwca. Wymagane dokumenty należy złożyć w Biurze ds. Nauki (ul. Boh. Westerplatte 64, gab. 426).

§3

ZASADY KWALIFIKACJI

Podstawowymi kryteriami kwalifikacji są:

- 1. Znajomość języka obcego:
 - 1) W pierwszej kolejności promowana jest znajomość języka obcego, w którym prowadzone są zajęcia w uczelni partnerskiej, w stopniu umożliwiającym studia.

Należy udokumentować znajomość ww. język poprzez:

- a) kopie certyfikatów, dyplomów / zaświadczeń od lektora:
- A1 1 pkt
- A2 3 pkt.
- B1 4,5 pkt.
- B2 5.5 pkt.
- C1 7 pkt.
- b) studenci kierunku filologia, którzy wyjeżdżają do uczelni, na której język wykładowy jest zgodny z językiem specjalności kandydata (6 pkt).
- c) ocena z egzaminu lub ocena z ostatniego roku nauki jęz. obcego, na kierunku innym, niż w pkt. 1b:
- 3,0-3 pkt.
- 4,0 4 pkt.
- 5,0-5 pkt.





- W drugiej kolejności brana pod uwagę jest znajomość jęz. angielskiego, o ile nie dotyczy pkt. 1.1 (punktowana na takich samych zasadach jak powyżej)
- 3) Średnia ocen za ostatni rok akademicki:

- 4) Działalność w AP (członkostwo w kołach naukowych, uczestnictwo w sesjach naukowych, promocja Uczelni i in.) (1-5 pkt.).
- 2. Komisja Rekrutacyjna zastrzega sobie możliwość przeprowadzenia rozmów kwalifikacyjnych z wybranymi kandydatami.
- 3. Ostatecznym warunkiem uczestnictwa w Programie jest zatwierdzenie kandydatury studenta przez uczelnię przyjmującą, która dokonuje akceptacji dokumentów przesłanych przez Biuro ds. Nauki.
- 4. Z zakwalifikowanymi studentami zostaje zawarta pisemna umowa.
- 5. Zakwaterowanie, podróż, opłaty rekrutacyjne oraz opłaty związane z wizą nie są finansowane. Student może wyjechać na studia lub szkolenie za granicą na okres nieprzekraczający 12 miesięcy w każdym cyklu studiów (licencjackich, magisterskich, doktoranckich).
- 6. Po ukończeniu danego okresu studiów za granica, student zobowiązany jest:
 - 1) dostarczyć zaświadczenie potwierdzające odbycie studiów w okresie objętym umową pomiędzy uczelnią a studentem (*Confirmation of Stay*),
 - 2) dostarczyć dokument o uzyskanych wynikach (Transcript of Records),
- 7. AP zobowiązuje się do uznania okresu studiów w uczelni partnerskiej pod warunkiem zrealizowania przez studenta programu uzgodnionego przed wyjazdem w dokumencie "Porozumienie o Programie Zajęć" (*Learning Agreement*).



International Student Application Instructions

- 1. Apply Online and Complete the Paper Application www.winona.edu/internationalservices
- 2. Pay the \$20 Non-Refundable Application Fee (pay online with credit card, with personal check or money order, payable to Winona State University)

3. Academic Records

High school & first year students submit your official high school transcript. An official English translation is required to accompany the transcript if the transcript is not issued in English by the school. (Students who have already completed high school, including university transfer applicants, should be sure to have final high school transcript submitted showing the graduation date. Also provide a detailed explanation of any educational gaps.)

Transfer Students submit official transcripts from all colleges/universities attended. If you have fewer than 24 semester credits completed, you must also submit your final high school transcript. A minimum of 2.4 GPA is required for admission. Before any possible transfer credit maybe awarded, all transcripts or academic records from universities outside the U.S. must be evaluated by a recognized outside agency as confirmation of the courses taken and grades earned. Admission to the University is the First Step.

Some degree programs may have additional standards for entrance into the major after you are enrolled at WSU. These include College of Business and College of Education degrees; and Nursing, Social Work, and Athletic Training majors.

Advanced Placement (AP)

WSU will give undergraduate course credit for scores of 3 or higher on Advanced Placement exams.

International Baccalaureate (IB)

Students who are enrolled in International Baccalaureate programs will be given credit for higher level examinations. A student will receive 3 or more course credits for scores of 4 or higher on individual Higher Level IB exams. Students who earn an IB diploma will be granted 6 undergraduate course credits for scores of 4 or higher on each Higher Level IB exam; and 2 undergraduate course credits for scores of 4 or higher on each Standard Level IB exam.

6. Documents Required for Issuing an I-20

- a) An official bank statement or verification of deposit certified and signed by a bank official. The amount certified must be equal to the estimated amount for one academic year. All documents must be dated within the past six (6) months of the application date.
- b) A copy of your passport or birth certificate
- If you are currently in the U.S. on a non-immigrant visa other than F-1 visa, you must send a copy of your passport with the visa page.
- d) If you are in the US with an F-1 visa, fill out the Transfer Recommendation form. (www.winona.edu/internationalservices/F-1.asp) and email it to bfaris@winona.edu to transfer your SEVIS record

7. Conditional Admission

Students who meet all admission requirements except for the English language proficiency requirement, may be conditionally admitted to the university and must enroll in the English Language Center at Winona State University. Students who successfully complete the English Language Center program are admitted to WSU.

8. Applying to English Language Center

To apply for ELC send, a completed application form; a non-refundable application fee of \$20 U.S. dollars; photocopy of your passport; original bank statement(s), an official high school or college transcript/diploma and a record of two semesters of English courses at either high school or college to the address below. 9. Graduate Addmission

All graduate applicants must apply online at www.winona.edu/gradstudies/how-to-apply.asp

And submit all required document to the Graduate Studies Office. To receive an-I-20 form, complete pages 3 & 4 of the International application and send a copy of your passport and an original bank statement to International Services.

12. Health Insurance and Immunization Requirements

You are required by Minnesota State law to enroll in the University Health Insurance. This annual premium is due and payable upon your arrival on campus.

You must also complete the immunization form at www.winona.edu/healthservices/immunizations.asp and submit to International Services.



Scholarships, Fees and Expenses

1. Cross-Cultural Scholarship (CCS)

The Cross-Cultural Scholarship is available to all international students who qualify for admission to Winona State University. CCS is equivalent to the difference between the resident rate of tuition and the non-resident rate of tuition. You will automatically receive the scholarship when you enroll as an International student at Winona State University. To maintain the scholarship you must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Maintain a valid F-1 or J-1 Immigration Status
- 2. Complete (3) Cross-Cultural Outreach projects during the academic year, starting in the fall and ending in the spring semester. These projects are called Minor Projects (2) and Major Project (1), for a total of three (3)
- 3. Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.50
- 4. Maximum length of scholarship is 9 semesters

2. Presidential Honor Scholarship

The Presidential Honor Scholarship is awarded only to first-year students coming to WSU directly from high school in recognition of academic excellence. The initial award is based on the student's SAT, ACT, TOEFL, or IELTS score.

The PHS scholarship is renewable if students meet the following requirements:

- 1. Be a full-time student (complete a minimum of 12 credits per semester)
- 2. Maintain a 3.50 cumulative grade point average at the end of each academic year
- 3. Live on-campus in WSU residence halls during their freshman year
